

OCM BOCES REACH Teacher is Mission US Educator of the Year



Congratulations to OCM BOCES alternative education teacher Marc Cizenski, for having been selected as Mission US Educator of the Year! New York Public Media recently named Cizenski, a classroom teacher

for the OCM BOCES REACH program in Liverpool, as the National Mission US Educator of the Year. The award is in recognition of Marc's outstanding efforts to use the innovative multimedia resource to enrich the teaching of American history with students in his classroom and educators across the state.

Mission US is a series of free role-playing games developed to transform the way middle school students learn U.S. history. The games, together with a rich variety of supplemental resources for students and teachers, are available at www.mission-us.org.

"When I was first introduced to Mission US by my principal, it seemed too good to be true," said Cizenski. "My students have had the opportunity to make the history of America come to life, through the eyes of people their own age. As an educator at an alternative school, 'Flight to Freedom' and 'For Crown or Colony?' have been extremely encouraging – my students are truly excited to be learning."

Cizenski was chosen as National Mission US Educator of the Year from among six finalists across the country. He will appear with the Mission US team on a panel about how scholarship, technology, and active learning are combining to bring American History to life at WNET's annual Celebration of Teaching & Learning in New York City on March 16, 2012.

Marc was nominated for the national award through his selection as local Mission US Educator of the Year by WCNY, Syracuse's local public television station.

Dear Staff:

We received good news in early February. Commissioner John King informed Ann Wright, OCM BOCES Board president, that:

As a result of the survey, I have determined that the Supervisory District and the Board of Cooperative Educational Services shall be maintained as currently organized, and the position of District Superintendent shall be filled upon the retirement of the present District Superintendent, Dr. Jessica Cohen, effective July 31, 2012.

The OCM BOCES Board has begun the search under the guidance of Jackie Starks, District Superintendent of the Madison-Oneida BOCES. The board will be asking for staff feedback on the process during meetings and in a survey. I encourage you to participate in these initiatives.

Our BOCES Adult Education graduations provide a lot more good news for our students and staff. I don't think that I will ever stop being amazed at the impact that BOCES and its staff have on our region. Last evening, as I watched the graduates of our adult education programs at McEvoy receive certificates, I thought about the many lives that were changed because of the career training that the students received, about the additional income that will be generated by the graduates, and at the increase in the economics of the area due to the newly trained medical assistants, auto technicians, HVAC workers, and electrical technicians. The CTC adult education ceremony was several weeks ago and more than 150 graduates entered the workforce as pharmacy technicians, cosmetologists, welders, medical assistants, dental assistants, and other skilled workers. Our follow up data for our programs shows significant success in passing the occupational tests and, most importantly, in becoming employed. Congratulations to the graduates and to our adult education staff.


Chili & Soup Cook-Off Spices Things up at Henry Campus

BOCES Employee Becomes US Citizen at a Ceremony Witnessed by Students



March is Health & Dental Plan Open Enrollment Month

March is open enrollment month. It is the one time per year that you may enroll in our health and/or dental plans if you are not currently enrolled. It is also the time you may opt to change your current coverage level from individual to family (without a qualifying event). You must be employed 50% or more on a salaried basis in order to be eligible for this benefit.

In order to take advantage, enrollment forms MUST BE RECEIVED no later than March 30, 2012. Any changes or enrollments will be effective April 1, 2012.
