On Monday, August 10th, 2009 the OCM BOCES Summer School Program, located at North Syracuse Junior High School, put on the musical concert "Around the World" under the musical direction of Mr. Robert Orioli. Two hundred and fifty five students from several different school districts worked together with the summer school staff to put together the lively musical production. Throughout the summer, the entire school worked on the theme, "Around the World." Classrooms signed up for different countries which they learned about and presented at the summer school concert, as was the summer Olympics that was held on August 11th with the help of Casey Brown, Renee McCall and Jon Conley, the summer school adaptive physical education teachers. In addition to the summer school concert, an art exhibit was set up in the foyer of the North Syracuse Junior High School so families could view the art work that students completed during the summer in their classrooms and during art classes. The students and staff worked very hard to put this production together, and it was enjoyed by all who attended and participated.

Preparation is Key for HINI Flu

Medical experts believe that the HINI virus (swine flu) will become more prevalent and widespread than ever beginning this fall. Last year's onset of the virus brought about the closing of several local schools, as districts worked with Onondaga, Cortland and Madison County Health Officials to control the spread of the flu.

As the new school year begins, preparedness is becoming the key to managing the flu. On Monday, August 10th, OCM BOCES brought together representatives from many of our 23 component districts with Onondaga County Health Commissioner Dr. Cynthia Morrow, stressing that "this is not a time for fear, but instead, a time for preparation."

There are steps that families can take to guard against the flu, including frequent and regular hand-washing, getting vaccinated against the flu, covering your mouth and nose when you cough or sneeze, learning about the flu and staying home from work or school for at least 24 hours after becoming symptom-free without medication.

This year, families are being encouraged to take the additional steps of developing a plan if a child becomes sick and needs to stay home, talking to your child(ren) about the flu and getting vaccinated against the HINI virus when the vaccine becomes available. It is possible that school districts will be providing the HINI vaccine at some school sites. Details will be provided as they are available.

Keep Our Facilities Looking New!

With all of the new and freshly-painted walls throughout OCM BOCES facilities, a plan for mounting papers, posters, pictures, etc. to walls in classrooms, offices and conference rooms has been developed. A large quantity of adhesive mounting putty has been ordered, and once received, will be distributed to all buildings for use by all staff. BOCES Employees - Get Your Flu/Pneumonia Shot!

BOCES has once again approved having an on-site flu clinic at several key sites. This will allow employees to conveniently get their flu and/or pneumonia shot without having to make a doctor's appointment or travel to area clinics. Access further information about the flu and the flu vaccine at www.cdc.gov/flu/keyfacts.htm.

This year the recommendation is to get the seasonal vaccinations earlier than usual to allow time for the HINI vaccine when it becomes available.

The cost for the vaccines is: flu - \$30.00; Pneumonia - \$60.00. Payment can be made by cash or check, payable to Regional Medical Services. Insurance forms will be available to submit for reimbursement. For those with Medicare or Medicare advantage programs, they will be accepted for payment.
